58% 9th graders took Biology I per OSPI Bio EOC pass rates divided by the number of 9th graders enrolled per OSPI. Of those that took it at that time, 83.8% passed. This is considered Path II (of a science Path I – III option). It is recommended by WSD materials (course guide) that students follow Path I, though Path II and Path III exist for those that want to choose to accelerate.
