I, Leesa Manion, Prosecuting Attorney for King County in the name and by the authority of the State of Washington, do accuse NOAH JORDAN ALLEN of the following crime[s], which are based on the same conduct or a series of acts connected together or constituting parts of a common scheme or plan: **Attempted Murder In The Second Degree, Attempted Murder In The Second Degree**, committed as follows:

Count 1 Attempted Murder In The Second Degree

That the defendant NOAH JORDAN ALLEN in King County, Washington, on or about March 17, 2026, with intent to cause the death of another person, did attempt to cause the death of James Allen, a human being; attempt as used in the above charge means that the defendant committed an act which was a substantial step towards the commission of the above described crime with the intent to commit that crime;

Contrary to RCW 9A.28.020 and 9A.32.050(1)(a), and against the peace and dignity of the State of Washington.

And further do accuse the defendant, Noah Jordan Allen, at said time of committing the above crime against a family or household member as defined in RCW 10.99.020, which is a crime of domestic violence as defined in RCW 10.99.020.

Count 2 Attempted Murder In The Second Degree


That the defendant NOAH JORDAN ALLEN in King County, Washington, on or about March 17, 2026, with intent to cause the death of another person, did attempt to cause the death

1 of Dylan Allen, a human being; attempt as used in the above charge means that the defendant
2 committed an act which was a substantial step towards the commission of the above described
crime with the intent to commit that crime;

3 Contrary to RCW 9A.28.020 and 9A.32.050(1)(a), and against the peace and dignity of
4 the State of Washington.

5 And further do accuse the defendant, Noah Jordan Allen, at said time of committing the
6 above crime against a family or household member as defined in RCW 10.99.020, which is a

3 PROSECUTING ATTORNEY CASE SUMMARY AND REQUEST FOR BAIL AND/OR
4 CONDITIONS OF RELEASE

5 The State incorporates by reference the Certification for Determination of Probable Cause
6 prepared by Deputy Laura Peckham of the King County Sheriff's Office for case number
7 **C26007411**.

8 The State requests bail set in the amount of **\$\$1,250,000.00**.

9 Pursuant to CrR 2.2(b)(2)(ii), the State requests bail remain in the amount of \$1,250,000.00.

10 Defendant refused court at first appearance and therefore, bail has not yet been addressed by a
11 court. The State is concerned that if released, the defendant will commit further violent acts, and
12 poses a significant risk to these victims, his other family members, and the community at large.

13 The State further requests the Court issue a no contact order protecting each Victim.

14 **Current Allegations:**

15 Defendant used a fixed blade knife with 5-6 inch blade to stab his father James and brother
16 Dylan multiple times each. James reported that Defendant stabbed him 4-5 times in the chest, left
17 arm, right shoulder, and believes his finger and shins were cut during the assault as well. Dylan
18 reported Defendant stabbed him in the chest, and was attempting to stab Dylan again when
19 Dylan grabbed Defendant's knife-hand and the blade of the knife, severely cutting Dylan's
20 fingers.

21 Defendant's family members describe him as having longstanding mental health issues but no
22 formal diagnosis due to a distrust of medical professionals. On this day, James went to
23 Defendant's area of the house to check on Defendant. During that interaction, Defendant made
24 statements to James to the effect of "I don't think violence is the answer." A short time later,

1
2 James went to check on Defendant again. This time Defendant said "I got to do this," brandished
3 a hunting knife, and then attacked James with it, stabbing James multiple times as described
4 above.

5 Dylan heard his father screaming for help and yelling "he's going to kill me." Dylan ran to
6 Defendant's area of the house. When Dylan got there he saw Defendant standing over James
7 stabbing James. Dylan sought to intervene to stop the attack and Defendant turned on him and
8 stabbed Dylan in the chest. Dylan described Defendant attempting to stab him again, but Dylan
9 grabbed Defendant's knife-hand and the blade of the knife as described above. At this point,
10 Dylan realized that the knife must have broken during Defendant's attack on James.

11 A fight over the knife ensued wherein Dylan and James attempted to disarm Defendant. Dylan
12 reported that at one point they were able to get the knife away from Defendant, but Defendant
13 regained it. At this point, Dylan put Defendant in a chokehold which allowed James to take the
14 knife from Defendant and run upstairs. Dylan had to keep Defendant in that chokehold until
15 officers arrived on scene.

16 Defendant actions in this case demonstrate an extreme risk of committing a violent offense in the
17 future. Defendant attacked two of his family members that all reside in the same household.

18 After stabbing each Victim in the chest, Defendant sought to continue his attack. Defendant was
19 only prevented from doing so because the Victims fought back and forcefully disarmed him. The
20 injuries sustained by each Victim would have likely been severely worse had they not been able
21 to do so.

22 The substantial risk of a future violent offense warrants bail in the amount of \$1,250,000.
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Order History: The Defendant's JABS shows no prior order history.

Warrant History: The Defendant's JABS shows no prior warrant history.

Criminal History: 2010 DUI, Solicitation VUCSA

2 CERTIFICATION FOR DETERMINATION OF PROBABLE CAUSE

3 That Laura Peckham is a (n) Detective with the King County Sheriff's
4 Office and has reviewed the investigation conducted in the King County
Sheriff's case number (s) C26007411;

5 There is probable cause to believe that Noah Allen committed the crimes
6 (s) of 2 counts of Attempted Murder in the Second Degree RCW 9A.32.050 .

7 This belief is predicated on the following facts and circumstances:

8 **Parties involved:** Heide-Marie Allen, 3/22/1958. Emily Allen, 4/12/1980. James
Allen (Heide's husband), 12/31/1954. Dylan G. Allen (Heide and James' son),
6/16/1981. Noah J. -Allen (Heide and James' son), 11/19/1984

9 **INITIAL RESPONSE**

10 On 03/17/2026 King County Sheriff's Office Deputies responded to **42755 SE**
11 **173rd PL North Bend**. The reporting party identified as Heide Allen called 911
stating, "my son is psychotic and stabbed my husband." Heide's son was later
12 identified as Noah Allen. Her husband as James Allen. Also in the home with
Heide at the time was her daughter Emily Allen and son Dylan Allen.
13 During the 911 call, Heide reported that James had gone downstairs to speak
with Noah and had been stabbed. She stated that her son, Dylan, then went
14 downstairs to see what was happening. Heide repeatedly pleaded, "please
help." When asked by dispatch whether anyone was "drunk or high," Heide
15 replied, "probably my son who's doing all this." She further stated that
James was downstairs screaming, saying, "he stabbed him." Heide reported she
was in a bedroom with her daughter, Emily, holding the door shut with her
body. She added that she was supposed to be in a wheelchair and could not
hold the door much longer.

16 During the call, James can be heard entering the room and stating, "he
17 stabbed me in the chest and he stabbed Dylan in the heart," at which point
Heide began screaming. Heide then stated, "he stabbed my son Dylan in the
18 heart, Noah stabbed Dylan in the heart, Noah stabbed my husband too." James
subsequently took the phone and stated, "I'm bleeding out right now," and
19 asked Heide to apply pressure to his lungs. James also stated that Dylan had
"choked him out" and subdued Noah, and added, "I'm up here dying."
20 Shortly after this KCSO Deputies arrive to render aid and take Noah into
custody. The KCSO Major Crimes Unit was notified and responded to take over
the investigation.

21 **NOAH ALLEN INTERVIEW** (Detective Peckham & Detective Newbauer @ Sammamish PD)
22 Detective Newbauer and I, Detective L. Peckham, sat with Noah in an interview
room within the holding area of the Sammamish Police Department. While Noah
remained in handcuffs, I advised him that I was audio recording. Noah stated
23 that he was aware and requested an attorney. No investigatory questions were
asked. Detective Newbauer and Detective McGrath placed Noah into a Tyvek suit
24 and took possession of his blood-soaked clothing as evidence. Patrol then
transported Noah to the hospital for medical evaluation prior to booking.

25 **HEIDE and EMILY ALLEN INTERVIEW** (Detective Blakeman @ the residence)

1 Both Heide and Emily were present for the interview, however Heide was the
2 main source for information. Heide described Noah as having longstanding
3 untreated mental health issues, which she believed were bipolar, along with
4 prior psychotic behavior, refusal to take medication, regular marijuana use
5 for "anxieties," and a severe recent decline related to his belief that he
6 could only survive by juicing because his digestive system was not working
7 properly. She said he had "not eaten for months," had lost a significant
8 amount of weight. As for the incident itself, Heide said James initially went
9 downstairs and later came back up saying Noah had responded, "violence isn't
10 the answer." James went back downstairs to speak with him again, Heide heard
11 James screaming, "I'm stabbed, he stabbed me." She then told Dylan to check
12 on James and called 911 while barricading herself and Emily in the upstairs
13 bedroom. Heide said James later came upstairs bleeding, reported that Noah
14 had stabbed him, and had the knife with him, but she did not see the assault
15 and did not hear Noah say anything during the altercation.

8 **JAMES ALLEN INTERVIEW** (Detective Cougan @ Harborview Medical Center)

9 James described Noah as someone who had been fighting mental health for
10 years. He said Noah had recently been on a "juicing kick," and had lost a
11 significant amount of weight, refused medical care, believed doctors were
12 "all out to get him." James recalled other statements Noah made, including
13 that people had "put curses on me," that he was "morphing," and that he felt
14 "half dog sometimes." James also said Noah had a history of drug use,
15 including mushrooms and heroin in the past, and currently used marijuana for
16 pain.

17 James said Noah was "acting a little strange" this morning, and made a
18 statement like, "I don't think violence is the answer." James said he became
19 concerned, spoke with his wife, and then went downstairs to check on Noah. He
20 said Noah was lying in bed in the dark, fumbling around in his pocket. James
21 said he asked Noah, "Hey, are, are you okay?" and, "Do you need help?" but
22 Noah responded by saying, "I gotta do this." Noah then stood up and pulled
23 out a hunting knife and "came after me with it."

24 James said Noah stabbed him multiple times and James screamed for help. Dylan
25 came downstairs and Noah "got off of me and came after him." James said that
when Dylan arrived, he was "on the ground getting stabbed." He estimated he
was stabbed 4-5 times, in the chest, left arm, right shoulder, and that his
finger and shin may also have been cut. James said that during the struggle
Dylan got Noah in a chokehold while James put his knee on Noah's arm and
pried that knife out of his hand. James then ran upstairs with the knife, hid
it in the bedroom, and told his wife to move the TV in front of the door and
lean on it until police arrived. James said he stayed upstairs applying
pressure to his wounds until deputies got there. He said he did not know
exactly what happened downstairs after that, other than hearing Dylan scream
once, and stated that Noah had never used violence on anybody before and that
it seemed like "he just snapped."

22 **DYLAN ALLEN INTERVIEW** (Detective Cougan @ Harborview Medical Center)

23 Dylan described Noah as having longstanding mental health and behavioral
24 issues, though he said he did not believe Noah had ever received a formal
25 diagnosis. He said Noah has had drug addictions in the past and has lived on
the streets. Dylan said Noah has been fixated for years on the belief that
there is something wrong with his bowel and that eating solid food will
"poison him," and he explained that for the past several months Noah had only
been drinking vegetable juice that he made himself. Dylan said Noah has manic

1 episodes where "if you hit the right note or ask him the right question, he
kind of goes into this mania."

2 Dylan said that early in the morning, his father came into his room and told
3 him Noah had come up to him and was speaking gibberish. Dylan said his father
4 told him Noah said, "I'm only staying around for Emily," and, "I've chosen
5 not to do violence." Dylan said his father then went to speak with his
6 mother, and about 15 to 20 minutes later Dylan heard his father screaming
7 from downstairs, "I need help," and, "He's gonna kill me." Dylan said he ran
8 downstairs and saw his father on the ground in a defensive position, while
9 Noah was over him with a knife, making a stabbing motion.

10 Dylan said he moved toward Noah to stop the assault, but once he closed the
11 distance, "he stabbed me," pointing to his chest. He said he recoiled, then
12 reengaged. Dylan said when Noah attempted to stab him again, he grabbed
13 Noah's knife hand and the blade with his right hand, cutting his finger
14 badly. He realized at that point Noah was grasping the blade of the knife to
15 stab me, and believed the handle had possibly broken during the assault on
16 James. Dylan said he and Noah wrestled through the downstairs area while his
17 father also began helping. Dylan said they initially got the knife away from
18 Noah, but Noah regained it. Dylan then got behind Noah and applied what he
19 described as a rear naked choke. Dylan said his father eventually got the
20 knife away from Noah and took it upstairs. Dylan stated that he kept Noah
21 restrained on the floor until deputies arrived, telling him, "just stay here
22 and don't try and get away or I'm gonna choke you." Dylan said Noah at one
23 point said he was "blacking out," and "all right, all right," before police
24 arrived and took him into custody.

25 Dylan said Noah did not say anything during the assault itself, either to him
or to James, other than later muttering that he was blacking out. Dylan
stated he believes Noah may also have said, "I'm sorry" at some point. Dylan
described the knife as having a blade about six inches long and being sharp
on both sides.

RESIDENTIAL WARRANT AND EVIDENCE AT SCENE

Detective Gerlitz authored a residential search warrant. King County Superior
Court Judge Sandra Widland reviewed and approved. **SW NO. SW 26-0-60937-6**
I, Detective Peckham, entered the residence with Detective Blakeman, who
conducted the initial walkthrough alongside members of the Washington State
Patrol Crime Scene Response Team. In the downstairs portion of the home, I
observed a significant amount of apparent blood on both the carpeted floor
and the walls. I also observed what appeared to be the black rubber handle of
a tactical-style sheath knife lying on the downstairs living room/bedroom
floor.

In the master bedroom, I observed a 5- to 6-inch knife blade resting on a
pile of clothing near the doorway to the master bathroom. The blade appeared
to have blood on it.

BODYWORN CAMERA REVIEW

Initial contact at the home was reviewed. Upon entering the split-level
residence, Deputy Macdonald proceeded downstairs, where he observed an adult
male on the floor covered in what appeared to be blood. During that footage,
Deputy Macdonald can be heard asking, "Who stabbed who?" A male, identified
as Noah, responds, "I stabbed him and my dad." At this time Dylan is still
downstairs near Noah getting aid by deputies. Noah was then taken into
custody without incident.

1 **CONCLUSION**

2 Based on the statements of the victims, witness accounts, and corroborating
3 evidence, there is probable cause to believe Noah Allen committed two counts
4 of Attempted Murder in the Second Degree. The unprovoked nature of the attack
5 and use of a knife to stab both family members multiple times demonstrates
6 intent to cause their deaths.
